The College located on a campus admeasuring 40217 square metres owes its pre-eminence in the sphere of education to Seth Gordhandas Jadavji Ruparel and his younger brother Seth Narayandas Jadavji Ruparel of Messrs Doongarsee Gangjee and Sons, Mumbai. In grateful appreciation of their generous and

profound interest in our institution, it was named 'The Doongarsee Gangjee Ruparel College'. Their father Seth Jadavji Doongarsee and uncle Seth Lalji Doongarsee, who had close association in business with Messrs Nowrosjee Wadia and Sons was continued by Seth Gordhandas and Seth Narayandas by the establishment of The Ruparel College in Mumbai; a sister institution of the Wadia College which the Wadia brothers, Sir Cusrow and Sir Ness helped the Society to establish in Pune.

The College situated in the Metropolitan City of Mumbai, is the only College of its kind that can boast of having a spacious campus with clean and green environment. It is located opposite Matunga Road Station (W.R.) and is a few minutes walk from Shivaji Park. The campus, known as the Ruparel College campus has Arts, Science, Library, Gymkhana and Canteen buildings, Boy's Hostel, Principal's bungalow, two Vice - Principal bungalows and the Administrative building. The New Law College functions from the Arts building of the Ruparel College.

Junior College (Higher Secondary) classes started functioning with the Degree College in 1975. In 1980, various bi-focal Vocational courses were introduced at the +2 stage. At present, Electronics, Computer Science and Electrical Maintenance are offered at the +2 stage. In 1988 - 89, Minimum Competency Vocational Course (MCVC) was introduced. The new Three Year Degree course was introduced by the University of Mumbai in 1977. The Commerce faculty was introduced in the College in 1979 - 80 and the first batch of T. Y. B.Com. students appeared in 1983.

The College has completed more than fifty years of glorious service in the field of academics, sports, performing arts and other extra curricular activities. The College, affiliated to the University of Mumbai has gathered the reputation and social recognition over the years as an institution second to none, a fact that is more than adequately proven by commendable performance of our students at the Higher Secondary Board and University examinations; I.I.T., Medical and Management

joint entrance examinations. About fifty percent of students in the merit list of H.S.C. examination are from our College.

The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) has accredited our College with the prestigious **Grade A** and we are one amongst the top 1% of the Colleges with higher grade in the country. With the **Grade A** status, we have been encouraged to set our goals higher and reach even greater heights of excellence.

For the last 25 years we are successfully running the 'Brihanmumbai Centre for Talent Search' (BCTS), which aims at young talent from schools and colleges to prepare for competitive examinations such as National Talent Search (NTS), Pre-medical Test (PMT) and IIT's JEE. More than 1500 students of this centre have secured the coveted NTS scholarships in the past 25 years.

The College has produced a number of luminaries in the field of academics, sports and extra curricular activities. Dr. Anil Kakodkar, Chairman, Atomic Energy Commission; Shri Anil Joshi, MD, Dena Bank; Shri Subhash Dandekar, Chairman, Camlin Industry; Shri Gajanan Pendharkar, MD, Vicco Laboratories, Shri Ajit Agarkar, Ramesh Powar (cricket), Miss Urmila Matondkar (Film star), Shri Ashok Hande (Stage Artist) are some few in a forest of luminaries.

The College has set its goals and objectives in tune with the aspirations of our students vis a vis the needs and expectations of the society. We strive to impart quality education to our students and encourage them to participate in various co and extra curricular activities to bring out the best of their talents so as to enrich their all-round personality development in the modern world of 21st century.

At present the College admits students for certain Post Graduate Courses for M.Sc. by Paper & by Research and Ph.D. Degree in subjects like Chemistry, Physics, Botany, Zoology, etc.

Keeping abreast with the advances in the world around and the need of the hour, the College is offering the following paper/courses on a No Grant Basis :

- Functional English as Vocational subject - under the scheme of the University Grants Commission in Arts Stream.

The College has acquired 2 lease lines of 128 kbps each for providing Internet facility to the students. In addition to the laboratories the Internet facility is available in all departments and on 16 terminals in the Library. Computerization of Office Administration & Library working is in full swing.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The College encourages students to participate in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. For this purpose students can enrol themselves as members of the following :

- (a) N. C. C. (Girls & Boys) and N. S. S.
- (b) Co-Curricular Activities like Gymkhana Activities including Cricket, Hockey, Foot-ball, Soft-ball, etc.
- (c) Literary Activities in English, Marathi, Hindi, Participation in Associations like Tattvadarshan, Swarsadhana, Social Sciences, Casso, Manas, Chitravedh, Rupela, Art to Art,
- (d) Performing Arts - Theatre and Music.

These associations organise various programmes, exhibitions and competitions at the Collegiate and Inter Collegiate level. Some of which are – Prof. L. G. Joag Memorial Lecture Series in Marathi, Music, Quiz, Essay, Debating, Elocution, Dramatics, Fine Arts, Flower arrangement, Photography, Handicrafts etc.

HOLIDAYS

The College shall remain closed –

- (a) on Sundays and public holidays as declared by the Government;
- (b) on holidays prescribed by the University both for the long vacations and for the Christmas break,
- (c) on such other days as the Principal may declare from time to time. (These will be announced on the Notice Board).

OFFICE HOURS

The College Office shall ordinarily be open on all working days between 10.00 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. All cash transactions will be attended to between 10.30 a.m. and 1.00 p.m. The office will remain closed on the second and fourth Saturdays of every month.

Students' Council

- 1) There shall a Students' Council as specified in The Maharashtra Universities Act, 1994 Section 40 2(b) for each conducted College or Institution of the University and each affiliated College, to look after the welfare of the students and to promote and co-ordinate the extra-curricular activities of different student's associations for better corporate life. The Council shall not engage in political activities.

The Students' Council for each Institution, conducted College and affiliated College shall consist of the following : –

- i) The Principal – Chairman,
 - ii) One lecturer, nominated by the Principal,
 - iii) Teacher in charge of The National Cadet Corps,
 - iv) The National Service Scheme Programme Officer,
 - v) One student from each class, who has shown academic merit at the examination held in the preceding year and who is engaged in full-time studies in the College, nominated by the Principal,
 - vi) Director of Sports and Physical Education, if any,
 - vii) One student from each of the following activities, who has shown outstanding performance, nominated by the Principal, namely :-
 - 1) Sports,
 - 2) National Service Scheme and Adult Education,
 - 3) National Cadet Corps,
 - 4) Cultural Activities.
 - viii) Two lady students nominated by the Principal;
- 2) The student members of the this Council shall elect from amongst themselves the Secretary of the Council.

HOSTEL

The College has a Hostel for 80 male students within the College campus. Hostel fees including services and other charges are to be paid in advance.

Hostelites will have to observe the rules and regulations strictly, failing which they will be **expelled** from the hostel.

The College Gymkhana

The College has a well-equipped Gymkhana, which provides the necessary space and equipment for both indoor and outdoor sports with the ground being modified for specific sports. Being a reputed institution, coaches of repute are associated with our College. The College has a tie-up with external agencies to enable students to avail of their facilities in sports like cricket, swimming, lawn tennis and badminton. An in-house Shooting Range has been installed in the College for indoor rifle shooting. Having sufficient space for both indoor and outdoor games, the College Gymkhana provides above average facilities for most of the games. For indoor games we have a hall of 61.50' x 25.25' for table tennis, a hall of 36' x 10' for carrom and a hall of 24' x 13' for chess. The open ground is used for kho-kho, kabaddi, volleyball, basketball, football, hockey, etc. Our College staff also provides its expertise to the University sports body. The activities of the Gymkhana are governed by the Principal with the assistance of the Gymkhana Chairman, Teaching, Non-Teaching Staff and student representatives.

Rules and Regulations for Railway Concession

- i) Students will be issued railway concession forms for Season tickets from the station nearest to their residence and Matunga Road (W. R) Station. Residential address given on the admission form will be taken as valid for this concession. **It cannot be changed during the course of the year.**

- ii) Long journey Railway concession will be issued to students to visit their homes.

Rules of Discipline

The smooth functioning of the college depends upon observance of discipline by the students. We are able to help the students better when rules of discipline are observed properly. Violation of these rules deprives the students of the advantages of different facilities provided by the college. Following are some of the important rules of discipline. Guardians and students are requested to co-operate observing these rules.

1. Students must attend at least 75 % of lectures tutorials, etc. as per the time table. They must not abstain themselves from classes, practicals, tutorials, examinations etc. without written permission of the Principal. Students whose attendance and/or progress in various tests and examinations is not satisfactory and who do not perform the required number of tutorials and/or practicals are likely to lose their terms. Prolonged absence even on grounds of ill health may also lead to loss of terms. Defaulters will not be sent up for University Examinations.
2. Employed students will not be given any concession in matters of attendance or rules regarding appearance at College examinations. Suitable disciplinary action will be taken against such students. Employed students must give details of their employment on the admission form. They are expected to take admission after consulting the Principal in this regard.
3. The Identity Card is meant for identifying bonafide students and is used for permitting the student to participate in various activities and programmes of the

college ***Every student must wear the identity card as long as he/she is in the College Campus.*** The identity card must be produced by the student whenever demanded by a member of the teaching or the non-teaching staff of the College. Every student must bring his /her identity card to the College every day, and must take proper care of his /her identity card. This will avoid misuse of identity cards by other students and outsiders. Loss of identity card should be immediately reported to the Principal and an application should be made for a duplicate identity card, which will be issued on payment.

4. The conduct of the students in the classes and in the premises of the College shall be such as will cause no disturbance to teachers, fellow students or other classes.
5. Every student is expected to use a clean and decent dress while coming to the college.
6. No Society or Association shall be formed in the College and no person should be invited on the College campus without the specific permission of the Principal. The Principal has a right to refuse such a permission.
7. No student will be allowed to display any Notice or Circular or Poster in the College premises without the prior permission of the Principal. Posting of Notices, Circulars, etc. on the College walls, doors, etc. is strictly prohibited. Strict action will be taken against students engaging in such activities.
8. No student will be allowed to conduct any political activity in the College premises.
9. College students are not allowed to bring their relatives or friends to the College premises. In fact no outsider can enter the College premises without the prior

permission of the Principal. Action will be taken against the concerned outsider as well as the College student who is instrumental in bringing outsiders to the College premises.

10. In College debates and other meetings arranged on the College premises, the chairman shall be a member of the teaching staff approved by the Principal . The subject of the debate or discussion must have the prior approval of the Principal. All meetings and programmes in the College campus must be held with the prior permission of the Principal.
11. Students must take proper care of the College property. Any damage done to the property of the College will have to be compensated either individually or collectively. Strict action will be taken against students damaging College property including electrical fittings, furniture, etc.
12. Students involved in malpractices at the College / Board / University examinations will not be admitted to the College.
- 13. Smoking is strictly prohibited in the College premises.**
14. If, for any reason, the continuance of a student in the College is found detrimental to the best interest of the College, the Principal, may ask him / her to leave the College, without assigning any reasons for his / her decision and the decision will be final & binding on him/her.
- 15. Playing music on Transistors/Tape-recorders/ Car-stereos/Mobile Telephones or any other similar gadgets is strictly prohibited. Defaulters will be punished and their instrument confiscated.**

16. **Use of Mobile Telephones is strictly prohibited in the academic area of the College which includes Arts and Science buildings, Lecture Halls, Laboratories, Library building, open areas between Arts and Science buildings and in front of the Arts building up to car parking area. Students may use them in Canteen building, Ladies Common Room, Hostel and from car parking area up to Ruby Mill Entrance gate. Defaulters will be penalized and their instrument confiscated.**
17. Boys found loitering near the Girls' Common Room will be liable for punishment.
18. Students must not attend classes other than their own without the permission of the authority concerned.
19. Students must not loiter on the College premises while the classes are at work.
20. Students shall do nothing inside or outside the College that will in any way interfere with the discipline of the College.
21. No students should communicate any information to the press about College matters without prior permission of the Principal.
22. Matters not covered above will be decided at the discretion of the Principal.

Acts of Misbehaviour, Misconduct or Indiscipline, Violating the Rules of Discipline mentioned above will be liable for punishment in the following manner :

- (A) Warning to the student.**
- (B) Warning to the student as well as a letter to the parents.**

- (C) Imposition of a fine.**
- (D) Denial of gymkhana, library, laboratory, N. C. C., N. S. S., student aid or any other facility for a specified period or for the whole term/year.**
- (E) Cancellation of terms**
- (F) Refusal to grant admission in the next term or academic year.**
- (G) Cancellation of admission.**
- (H) Expulsion from the college for a specified period.**
- (I) Rustication.**

Library

The College Library has a separate building with spacious Stock Room, Reading halls for Staff, Boys and Girls. The Library has a huge collection of books & journals on a variety of subjects.

Library Rules

1. While entering the library, students should carry their Identity as well as Library cards.
2. Students will ensure that they do not disturb other students in the library.
3. Books are issued for home reading for a period of one week only against a demand slip (duly filled and signed) on days notified for this purpose. Reference Books and prescribed text books kept in the reading hall, Dictionaries, Encyclopaedias, Atlases and other books classified as reference books must be used in the library only during working hours.

4. A student failing to return books issued for home reading on or before the due date will be liable to pay a fine of Rs. 5/- per day till such time as the book is returned.
5. Students will not be issued more than one book at a time for home reading. While returning books students will ensure that the necessary entry of return is made in his / her presence.
6. Books issued against the Identity Card are for use in the Reading Hall only and must be returned while leaving the library. Disciplinary action will be taken against students violating this rule.
7. Students can avail of the Internet facility on payment of nominal charges.

**GOVERNMENT OF INDIA POST SSC
FREESHIP/SCHOLARSHIP FOR
RESERVE CATEGORY STUDENTS
(DEGREE AND JUNIOR COLLEGE)**

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS :

1. Reserve category students who have taken admission in the College are informed that it is mandatory to submit duly filled in Freeship/Scholarship Application Forms on or before 20th July along with the necessary documents to avail the benefit of Freeship/Scholarship.
2. They are advised to refer notices pertaining to Freeship/Scholarship displayed on the Notice Board from time to time. A detailed schedule for submission of duly filled in Application Forms will be displayed on the Notice Board.
3. As Parents Annual Gross Income Certificate issued by Tahasildar is an important document required for

sanction of Scholarship/Freeship, students are advised to immediately commence the procedure to procure the same, so as to submit it on or before 20th July.

4. They are informed that if they fail to submit duly filled in Application Forms along with the necessary documents within the stipulated period, they will be treated as Open Category students and will be required to pay Full Fees.
5. Eligible Reserve Category students will be exempted from paying full fees. The proposal will be sent to the Social Welfare Department, Government of Maharashtra for its sanction. They will be required to pay the Fees not sanctioned by the Social Welfare Department in the Second Term.

**REQUIREMENTS FOR GOVERNMENT OF INDIA
POST-SSC SCHOLARSHIPS:**

1. Students belonging to SC and ST category and whose Parents Gross Annual Income is less than Rs.1,00,000/- are eligible to apply for this Scholarship. Students will be required to submit Parents Gross Annual Income Certificate issued by Tahasildar.
2. Students belonging to OBC, SBC, VJ and NT category and whose Parents Gross Annual Income is less than Rs.65,290/- are eligible to apply for this Scholarship. Students will be required to submit Parents Gross Annual Income Certificate issued by Tahasildar.

To avail of this Scholarship, students must submit the following documents along with the duly filled in Application Form as per the schedule displayed on the Notice Board:

1. Original and one attested copy of Parents Gross Annual Income Certificate issued by Tahasildar for the previous financial year.

2. Attested copy of the Caste Certificate in the name of student issued by Competent Authority of the Government of Maharashtra.
3. Attested copy of the First and last pages of Ration Card.
4. Attested copy of Mark sheet of the previous Examination passed.
5. If a student is residing in a Hostel, he/she should attach a Certificate from the Warden of the Hostel, stating the date of joining the Hostel along with Lodging and Boarding charges.
6. If a student has a gap between two academic years, he/she will be required to submit Court Affidavit explaining the reasons for the gap period.

REQUIREMENT FOR GOVERNMENT OF INDIA POST SSC FREESHIP :

1. Students belonging to SC and ST category and whose Parents Gross Annual Income is more than Rs.1,00,000/- are eligible to apply for this Freeship. Students will be required to submit Parents Gross Annual Income Certificate issued by Tahasildar.
2. Students belong to OBC, SBC, VJ and NT category and whose Parents Gross Annual Income is more than Rs.65,290/- are eligible to apply for this Freeship. Students will be required to submit Parents Gross Annual Income and Non-Creamy layer Certificates issued by Tahasildar.
3. Students should note that **third male child is not eligible** to avail the benefit of this Freeship.

To avail of this Freeship, students must submit the following documents along with the duly filled in Application Form as per the schedule displayed on the Notice Board:

1. Attested copy of Parents Gross Annual Income Certificate issued by Tahasildar for the previous financial year.
2. Attested copy of the Caste Certificate in the name of student issued by Competent Authority of the Government of Maharashtra.
3. Attested copy of the First and last page of Ration Card.
4. Attested copy of Mark sheet of the previous Examination passed.
5. If a student is residing in a Hostel, he/she should attach a Certificate from the Warden of the Hostel, stating the date of joining the Hostel along with Lodging and Boarding charges.
6. If a student has a gap between two academic years, he/she will be required to submit Court Affidavit explaining the reasons for the gap period.

In addition to the above-mentioned documents, students **belonging to OBC, SBC, VJ and NT category** will be required to submit an attested copy of Non-Creamy Layer Certificate issued by Tahasildar.

In addition to the above-mentioned documents, **students belonging to ST category** will be required to submit the following documents:

1. Attested copy of student's School Leaving Certificate.
2. Attested copy of father's Caste Certificate and School Leaving Certificate.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION JUNIOR COLLEGE

- i) Students who pass the S.S.C. Examination conducted by

the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary Education, are eligible for admission to the First Year (Std. XI) of the Junior College.

- ii) Students who pass an Examination equivalent to S.S.C. conducted by any other Board, must comply with the procedures of obtaining an eligibility certificate at the time of admission from the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary & Higher Secondary Education, Mumbai Divisional Office, Vashi, New Mumbai - 400 703.

DEGREE COLLEGE

- i) Students who pass the Higher Secondary Certificate (H.S.C.) Examination conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary & Higher Secondary Education, are eligible for admission to the F.Y.B.A. /B.Sc. /B. Com./ B. M. S. / B. Sc (IT).
- ii) Students who pass the H.S.C. or equivalent examination of any other Board must produce an eligibility certificate issued by the Eligibility Section, University of Mumbai, Kalina, Mumbai - 400 098.

FEES

1. Students should pay the prescribed fees to the Accounts Section or Special Counters opened for the purpose at the time of admission to the F.Y.J.C. (Arts / Science/ Commerce) and F. Y. B. A. / B. Sc. / B. Com. / B. M. S. / B. Sc.(IT) classes.
2. Schedule of fees will be displayed on the College Notice Board.
3. Fees will be accepted in **Cash/Cheque** for both the Junior & the Degree College.
4. Guardians should ensure that they obtain a stamped receipt immediately after any payment is made.

5. Care should be taken to ensure that payments are not made to unauthorised persons. The College will not be responsible for any lapse in this matter.
6. Reserve Category Students must fill the Freeship / Scholarship forms as per the schedule displayed on the Notice Board.

REFUND OF FEES

JUNIOR COLLEGE

- a. If a Student informs the institution before the commencement of the academic year that he/she wants to withdraw and he/she cannot continue his/her education in the same institution for any reason, the institution concerned should refund to him/her in full the tuition fee, term fee, laboratory fee (if any) and library and laboratory deposits, if any actually recovered. The admission fee may, however, be retained by the Institution.

EXPLANATION : So far as the F.Y.J.C. classes are concerned the academic year should be deemed to have commenced from the eighth day (i.e. excluding Sundays and Public Holidays) from and including the days of declaration of the S.S.C. Examination Result. If the said day of declaration of results is a working day, OR from and including the working day immediately following the day of declaration of the S.S.C. Examination result if the said / date of declaration of results is a Sunday or a Public Holiday.

- b. If a student desires to withdraw and applies for refund of fees after the commencement of the academic year (vide explanation under (a) above) the institution concerned should retain the admission fee, term fee and laboratory fee (if any) in full. The library and laboratory deposits should however be refunded. So far as the tuition fee is concerned the institution should retain the tuition fee only for the month (s) beginning from the month in which the academic

year had commenced and ending with the month in which the student had applied for withdrawal of admission or refund of fees. The tuition fees for the remaining months of the term should be refunded (For example, if a student applies for refund of fees in the month of July, after the academic year has commenced in that month itself, the Institution should retain the proportionate amount of tuition fees for one month only, namely the month of July. On the other hand, if a student applies for refund of fees in the month of August, after the academic year has commenced in the month of July, the institution should retain the proportionate amount of tuition fee for two months only, namely the month of July & August. If a student applies for refund of fees in the month of August after the academic year has commenced in the month of June, the institution should retain the proportionate amount of tuition fee for three months only, namely the months of June, July, August.)

DEGREE COLLEGE

On cancellation of Admission, refund of fees will be as per the guidelines of University of Mumbai. The refund amount will be paid by cheque within 15 working days from the date of cancellation of Admission.

TESTS AND EXAMINATIONS JUNIOR COLLEGE

- a) Students will be required to appear for First Mid Term and Terminal Examination in the First Term and Second Mid Term and Annual Examination in the Second Term.
- b) Attendance at these Examinations is compulsory. Students who do not appear for these Examinations will not be granted Terms.
- c) Guardians/Parents should verify the performance of their wards at each Examination by referring to the College Notice Board or by contacting the Vice - Principal of Junior College.

Rules regarding promotion to S. Y. J. C. Class :

According to the rules of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, Pune, promotion to S. Y. J. C. Class will be determined on the basis of marks obtained in:

- (a) First Mid Term Examination : Out of 50 Marks (each subject)
- (b) Terminal Examination : Out of 100 Marks (each subject)
- (c) Second Mid Term Examination: Out of 50 Marks (each subject)
- (d) Annual Examination : Out of 100 Marks (each subject)

The final result of a student will be decided on the basis of the average marks obtained at these examinations. Minimum marks for passing in a subject are 35% and students will be required to pass in all the subjects for promotion to S. Y. J. C. Class.

DEGREE COLLEGE

First Year and Second Year B.A./B. Sc./ B. Com. Examinations :

First and Second year B.A., B.Sc. and B. Com. Examinations will be conducted by the College on behalf of University of Mumbai .

All rules and regulations of the University of Mumbai in force, or as modified from time to time, shall apply. In order to be permitted to appear at the First Year/Second Year Examinations, it is necessary for the candidates to have a minimum of 75% attendance for lectures/practicals and also to have kept terms and to have completed the course of study to the satisfaction of the Principal of this college. The decision of the Principal in this regard shall be final.

As per University of Mumbai Circular No. UG/344 of 2002 dated 17-08-2002, following are the Rules for conduct of first and Second year B.A., B.Sc. and B. Com. Examinations:

- 1) **First and Second Term Examinations** : There shall be two examinations, one at the end of each term and they shall be called First Term Examination and Second Term Examination respectively. Both Term Examinations shall be of equal marks and of equal duration. The First Term Examination shall be based on the portion of the syllabus taught in First Term and the Second Term Examination shall be based on the portion of the syllabus taught in Second Term as prescribed by the Boards of Studies and approved by the Academic Council.

The Practical Examination in a subject shall be held only once and before the end of Second Term.

- 2) **Schemes for paper without practical and paper with practical.**

(Marks secured at each term examination are to be converted out of 30 marks)

Practical Examination Marks 40 per paper

Note : In subjects where project/ tutorials are prescribed as part of workload in the syllabus, the papers in such subjects for each term examination shall be of 50 marks and 2 hrs duration. Marks secured in each paper shall be appropriately converted into theory component (marks out of 40 or 45 as applicable) and remaining marks shall be treated for project/tutorials as applicable.

- 3) **Additional Examination : (A) Eligibility to appear at the additional examination** : A student who does not appear in some or all the papers, either at the First Term Examination or at the Second Term Examination on medical grounds or for representing the college /

University in sports, cultural activities, activities of NCC, NSS, conducted by recognized bodies/ competent authorities or for any other reason which is considered valid under exceptional circumstances and to the satisfaction of the Principal is eligible to appear for the additional examination.

A student who does not appear at both term examinations shall not be eligible to appear for the additional examination.

(B) Nature of the additional examination : The additional examination shall be of two hours duration and of 50 marks per paper/ subject. The student shall appear for the paper /subject of the term examination which he / she has missed.

Note : In subjects having papers with practicals and in subjects where project/tutorials are prescribed as part of workload in the syllabus, the marks obtained in such a paper / subject shall be converted appropriately as explained in (4) above.

- 4) **Standard of Passing :** The passing in the subject shall be based on the aggregate of marks of the First and Second Term examinations taken together or marks of first term examination and the additional examination taken together or marks of second term examination and the additional examination taken together.

The appearance at both term examinations, tutorial evaluation and the practical examination shall be compulsory.

In order to pass in a subject a student must secure :

- a) A minimum of 35% marks in subject, having only one paper.
- b) In a subject having more than one paper, a minimum of 20% marks in each paper and a minimum of 35% marks in aggregate.
- c) In case of subject with practicals a minimum of 35% marks in practicals separately.

B.Sc. (Information Technology)

Eligibility for Admission to F. Y. B.Sc.(I.T.)

Eligibility 5051 : A candidate for being eligible for admission to the degree course in Bachelor of Science - Information Technology, shall have passed XII Std. Examination of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent with **Mathematics as** one of the subject and should have secured not less than 45% marks in aggregate and 40% marks in aggregate in case of reserved category candidates.

or

Candidates who have passed Diploma in Computer Engineering / Computer Science / Computer Technology / Information Technology / Electrical, Electronics / Allied Branches, Mechanical and Allied branches, Civil and Allied branches of Engineering are eligible for admission to the First Year of the B.Sc. (I.T.) degree course. However, the Diploma should be recognized by the Maharashtra State Board of Technical Education or any other recognized Government body. Minimum marks required 45% aggregate for open category candidates and 40% aggregate for reserved category candidates.

AND

Students with post HSC - Diploma in Computer Engineering / Computer Science / Computer Technology will be eligible for direct admission to the Second Year of B.Sc. (I.T.) However, the Diploma should be recognized by the Maharashtra State Board of Technical Education or any other recognized Government body.

Admissions to F.Y.B.Sc. (I.T.) class will be done on the basis of marks secured in the subject of Mathematics at the H.S.C. (XII Std.) Examination of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher

Secondary Education or its equivalent. Reservation will be as per the guidelines of University of Mumbai.

R 4411 - Passing Standards

1. A student is said to have passed if he / she secures 40% of marks allotted in each head of passing. Theory of 100 marks and (TW / Practical / Tutorial of 50 marks) are treated as separate heads of passing.
2. A student is said to have passed a Semester if he / she passes in all heads of passing of the semester.
3. A student is eligible to be admitted to Semester II irrespective of Number of heads of failure in the First Semester.
4. A student is eligible for admission to Semester III if either the student passes Semester I & Semester II

OR

The student fails in a combination of Theory and/or Practical taken in Semester I or Semester II or together where the total marks does not exceed 200.

5. A student is eligible for admission to Semester IV irrespective of Number of heads of failure in Semester III. However, the student has to clear Semester I and II, in order to appear for Semester IV examination.
6. A student is eligible for admission to Semester V if either the student passes Semester III and IV

OR

The student fails in a combination of Theory and/or Practical taken in Semester III or Semester IV or together, where the total marks does not exceed 200.

7. A student is eligible for admission to Semester VI irrespective of number of heads of failure in Semester V. The results of VI should be kept in abeyance until the student clears Semesters III, IV and V in full.
8. The class is awarded Semester wise for Semesters I, II, III & IV. However, Semesters V and VI will be taken together for award of class i.e. in final year.

1. Award of class is based on first attempt and all papers given in the same sitting.
2. Students passing in parts will be awarded Pass class irrespective of the cumulative percentage of marks.

Admission Procedure:

1. At the time of submission of duly filled in Admission Form S.Y.B.Sc. (I.T.) and T.Y.B.Sc. (I.T.) students must attach Photo (Xerox) copies of the mark sheets of the previous Examination passed.
2. At the time of Admission and payment of fees, students should submit duly filled in Admission Form along with
 - Photo (Xerox) copies of the mark sheets of all the previous Examinations,
 - Duly filled in Identity Card and Photo Slips with recent Passport size photographs affixed on them,
 - Photo (Xerox) copies of Caste Certificate from competent authority in case of students belonging to Reserve category.
3. At the time of Admission, students should produce Original mark sheets of all the previous Examinations and Original Caste Certificate (if applicable) for verification.
4. They should also bring with them additional Passport size photograph for Temporary Identity Card.
5. The timings for submission of Admission Forms and payment of Fees will be from 10.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m.
6. Fees will be accepted in cash, cheque or Demand Draft. Cheques/Demand Drafts should be drawn in favour of Principal, D. G. Ruparel College.

Registration as postgraduate student: Every candidate admitted for M.Sc. (IT) will have to register as a postgraduate student of Mumbai University.

Scheme:

There will be 4 papers per year. Each paper will have 100 marks for theory and 50 marks for practical/case study/seminars.

- a) For M.Sc. Part I all the papers will be compulsory.
- b) M.Sc. Part II will have two subjects compulsory and two elective subjects

Each paper will have minimum 4 Theory lectures per week each lecture is of 1 hr duration. The lectures will be organized in such a way that each paper will have minimum 100 hrs contact sessions for the year.

Standard of passing:

For M.Sc. Part I: To pass examination a candidate will have to secure

- 1) Minimum 20% marks in each theory paper and minimum 40% marks in aggregate for all the subjects.

For M.Sc. Part II: To pass examination a candidate will have to secure

- 1) Minimum 20% marks in each theory paper and minimum 40% marks in aggregate including dissertation work on the project..
- 2) The submission of dissertation work is compulsory and student should appear for viva for the same.

The candidate is allowed to keep terms for maximum of all the subjects for the Part I but can take admission Part II. However the result of such student for Part II examination will not be declared till candidate successfully completes Part I examination.

STANDARD OF PASSING

1. A candidate shall have to obtain a minimum of 50 % marks in aggregate of each theory paper and a minimum grade of C in the project wherever applicable to pass a particular semester provided that the candidate must have obtained a minimum of 35% of marks in semester end examination for each theory paper.
2. A candidate shall be placed in First Class with Distinction if she/he secures a minimum of 50% marks in each theory paper and with a minimum Grade of C in the project in Semester V and atleast 70% marks in theory papers of Semesters V and VI taken together in aggregate.
3. A candidate shall be placed in First Class if she/he secures a minimum of 50% marks in each theory paper and with a minimum Grade of C in the project in Semester V and atleast 60% marks in theory papers of Semesters V & VI taken together in aggregate.

4. A candidate shall be placed in Second Class if she/he secures a minimum of 50% marks in each theory paper and a minimum Grade of C in the Semester V project and less than 60% marks in theory papers of Semesters V & VI taken together in aggregate.
5. A candidate who fails in any particular theory paper/s shall be allowed to reappear for that theory paper/s however; his/ her internal evaluation marks shall be carried over. But he/ she shall not be entitled to any class on passing.
 - (a) A candidate shall be allowed to keep terms for Semester II if she/he passes Semester I OR if he/she fails in not more than two theory papers of Semester I.
 - (b) A candidate shall be allowed to keep terms for Semester III if she/he passes Semester I and Semester II OR if she/he fails in not more than two theory papers of Semester I and Semester II taken together.
 - (c) A candidate shall be allowed to keep terms for Semester IV if she/he passes in each of Semester I, II and III OR if she/he passes Semester I and fails in not more than two theory papers of Semester II and Semester III taken together.
 - (d) A candidate shall be allowed to keep terms for Semester V if she/he passes in each of Semester I, II, III and IV OR if she/he passes Semester I and Semester II and fails in not more than two theory papers of Semester III and IV taken together.
 - (e) A candidate shall be allowed to keep terms for Semester VI if she/he passes in each of Semester I, II, III, IV and V OR if she/he passes Semester I, Semester II, Semester III and fails in not more than two theory papers of Semester IV and Semester V taken together, irrespective of his/ her Grade in Project I of Semester V.
 - (f) A candidate who does not secure a minimum grade of C in the project has to submit a fresh project till she/ he secures a minimum grade of C.

6. The evaluation of Project and viva- voce examination shall be by awarding grade in the seven point scale noted below:-

A candidate shall obtain Grade C in this seven points scale grade in project evaluation and viva- voce taken together to obtain 50% marks in project work.

Semester I, II, III, IV exams are conducted by the college as per the university rules and regulations.

Semester V, VI are external exams which will be conducted by the University of Mumbai for 60 marks while 40 marks will be internal assessment conducted by the college.
