1. Tools like posters, diagrams, graphs, charts, maps, 3-D models, preserved and live specimen are used to enhance the conventional lectures. Interactive methods like mock interviews, viva, debates, word games, quizzes, worksheets enhance the participation and interest of the students.



3.26 Major Activities during the year in the sphere of extension activities and Institutional Social Responsibility

#### NSS Activities- Area Based Projects

<u>Entrepreneurship Development Project</u>: Entrepreneurship Development Project was organized in collaboration with Rajiv Gandhi Institute of Youth Development from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> August 2015. This project was organized to motivate and guide students about entrepreneurship, what is essential to start a small enterprise, how to start an enterprise and sources for raising capital.

<u>Education Project</u>: A 10 day educational project at Vangani in Aanudanik Aadivasi Aashram karav School. The students of Std I to VII were taught English Grammar, Yoga, Drawing and Dancing. On the last day Essay Writing and Handwriting Competitions were held for the students.

<u>Umed:</u> UMED...Aasha Jagnyachi 2015-2016 was organized on 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> February 2016. Umed is a talent showcase for senior citizens and differently-abled persons to showcase their talents. Competitions like singing, poetry, cooking, Umed King and Queen were organised. The programme received an enthusiastic response from senior citizens.

<u>Dengue Malaria Awareness</u>: The NSS unit in collaboration with BMC participated in Dengue Malaria awareness campaign to create awareness regarding the disease and to attempt to control the spread of dengue malaria cases. The areas covered included Dadar (G-North ward), Mahim Darga , Matunga Labour camp.

<u>One Day Camp</u>: One day visit at Karav Aadivasi Vangani on 26<sup>th</sup> August 2015.

Sessions on Yoga, Career Guidance and Health and Fitness were conducted and a Street play about Cleanliness and Anti-Narcotics was performed.

<u>Blood Donation Camp</u>: A blood donation camp was organised in the College on 29<sup>th</sup> July 2015 in association with St. George Hospital. 121 units of blood were collected.

<u>Organ Donation</u>: A seminar on *Organ Donation* was organised on 30<sup>th</sup> November, 2015 in collaboration with ZTCC (Zonal Transplant Co-ordination Centre).

<u>AIDS Awareness Day</u>: Students were distributed information brochures about AIDS. Street play giving information about causes and consequences about AIDS were presented.

College Based Projects

Yoga Day: International Yoga Day was celebrated on 21<sup>st</sup> June, 2015.

<u>NSS Day:</u> The NSS volunteers celebrated the NSS day i.e. 24<sup>th</sup> September 2015 with the children of Kasarwadi and with the children of Family Home Guild of Service. The volunteers spread awareness about education, donated old clothes and stationery to needy children and organised games and activities for them.

<u>College Clean-Up Drive</u>: The Clean-Up drive was organized on 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> December 2015. Various areas of the college campus were cleaned and message of Swach Bharat Abhiyan was promoted.

<u>Paper bag making and distribution:</u> NSS Unit conducted a paper bag making and distribution project on 7<sup>th</sup>January 2016. Each NSS volunteer prepared 50 paper bags. A total of 1000 paper bags were made and distributed to local shopkeepers in order to promote the use of paper bags and prevent use of plastic bags.

<u>MAVA Seminar:</u> MAVA (Men Against Violence and Abuse) organized a one-day seminar for the students of the college on 17<sup>th</sup> December 2015. The aim was to create gender sensitition among students. This information helped the students to understand gender related issues. Mr. Harish Sadani addressed students on women empowerment.

<u>Republic Day Celebration</u>: After the flag hoisting ceremony, NSS volunteers performed songs, dances, yoga demonstration and a street play. Tree plantation was carried out in the College campus. University Based Projects:

Ganesh Immersion Project: The NSS volunteers assisted the Mumbai Police in Crowd Management on 18<sup>th</sup>, 21<sup>st</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2015 at Dadar Chowpatty. They also convinced people to dispose the garlands and the other material properly.

A documentary about Malala Yousufzai was screened at the University of Mumbai on 7<sup>th</sup>

November2015. Two voulnteers were selected to perform a street play on Education for Girls.

Leadership Training Camp: Ms. Aishwarya Burpalle and Mr. Pawan Purohit participated in the

Leadership Training Camp organised by University of Mumbai at Badlapur from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> September 2016.

Under Annapurna Yojana Project, students exhibited their talent by preparing colourful diyas and candles. These articles were sold by the students on the college campus. These students made good profit out of it.

Under Industry Orientation Programme projects,-students worked as volunteers at Nehru Science Center, in College library and in one dispensary.

Seventeen students from the DLLE Unit participated in Udaan Festival held at University Club House. Twelve students presented a Street Play titled 'Bali Rajyache Rajya Yeu De' and won the Third prize in the competition. Five students participated in Poster competition.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The use of ICT in the teaching-learning process has increased. Academically weak students are guided in order to identify their weak areas and to improve their performance in examinations. Some departments have a Mentorship Programme in order to maximize the potential of their students. Some departments hold Study Skills workshops in order to inculcate effective study habits among the students.

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Internal Tests for some subjects were prepared online using Moodle or by using Radioresponse Devices. This was aimed at reducing the burden of assessment faced by teachers. However, these tests could not be conducted online as the University had forbidden the conduct of online examinations for internal tests.

Detailed guidelines for Supervision and Assessment work are given to each teacher in the form of a printed handout. This ensures proper discipline during examinations as well as uniformity in the assessment method.

Examination papers are assessed in the Centralised Assessment Programme (CAP). Moderation is carried out wherever required by external experts as per the rules of the University.

Physically disabled students / students with learning disabilities are given proper facilities like separate seating, additional time as well as grace marks in the examinations.

Photocopies of examined/moderated papers are given to students, on demand.

Facility of re-evaluation is available as per the guidelines of the University.

All these rules are followed as per the guidelines of the University.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

'Avishkar Committee' continued to guide for the research activity done by the students. 106 students participated in the research convention 'Avishkar' conducted by the University of Mumbai. 13 students qualified for the interzonal round and one student represented the University at the State level competition. The College funded the expenses of all the participants. Avishkar Research Convention for zonal Category was conducted for the first time in the College. Students and faculty were
